"Come In Here!"

Based on Matthew 4:18-22 (NIV) January 29, 2017 Neil Peck, preaching

Matthew 4:18 - As Jesus was walking beside the Sea of Galilee he saw two brothers, Simon called Peter and his brother Andrew. They were casting a net into the lake, for they were fisherman.

- [⊕] The Sea of Galilee is <u>13</u> miles long and <u>8</u> miles across.
- [⊕] The Sea of Galilee was thick with fishing boats and they used <u>3</u> methods of fishing, which were, fishing by <u>line</u>, fishing with a <u>casting</u> net, and the <u>drag</u> net.

Matthew 4:19-21

- 19 "Come, follow me," Jesus said, "and I will make you fishers of men." 20 At once they left their nets and followed him.
- 21 Going on from there, he saw two other brothers, James son of Zebedee and his brother John. They were in a boat with their father Zebedee, preparing their nets. Jesus called them,
- → It is possible that some of these men may have been disciples of John the Baptist.
- **[⊕]** Jesus came to these men and <u>challenged</u> them once and for all to follow him.

- **[↑] Jesus chose <u>ordinary</u> men.**
- [⊕] Jesus <u>wants</u> and <u>needs</u> people like the disciples, like me, who will <u>give myself</u> to him and follow him.

† Peter, Andrew, James and John were professional <u>fishermen</u>.

- → What are the good qualities of a Fisher of Men?
 - Patience
 - Perseverance
 - Courage
 - Have good sense
 - The right bait
 - Keep my focus on Christ.

Matthew 4:22 - and immediately they left the boat and their father and followed him.

♦ When Jesus called, these men were <u>motivated</u> to get up and leave their jobs.
